Walther on New Year

As we get ready to move into a new year, I think that there are some reasons to be hopeful for 2015. Gas prices are starting to go down, which will have a positive impact on so many areas of our lives. There are newly elected officials who will hopefully bring fresh ideas to our state and federal governments. Figures indicate that the number of aborted babies in the United States is going down, or at least not increasing. I think people are looking forward to a new year, a year of happiness, prosperity, change, and so they ring in the New Year with bells, whistles, and parties. But what a lot of these people don't realize is that their hopes and dreams for 2015 mean nothing without realizing the true blessings of the New Year, and their hopes and dreams will be worthless without the true joy that can only come from a living and active faith in Christ.

C.F.W. Walther (the first president of the LCMS) covered this well in a New Year's Day sermon. He said,

"The most necessary thing for a truly happy and blessed beginning to a new year is that we do not carry forward the sins of the old year. Isn't the rich person very poor if he still lacks the most important good – the grace of God? How can such a person be truly happy if he cannot rejoice in the forgiveness of sins? How can he truly be at peace today if he must still fear that God is angry with him, that he has not been reconciled with his heavenly Father? Indeed, only the person who carries this comfort in his heart can enter the new year truly happy and blessed. He knows that all

his past sins are forgiven and buried in the depths of the sea. He can draw near to God as a child draws near to his dear father. On our own we merit nothing before God. Even if we could cry bloody streams of tears, perform the greatest work of repentance and submerge ourselves in the deepest sorrow and contrition we could not wash from our soul even one of the past year's sins and we could not satisfy the offended righteousness of God.

"There is only one who can wipe out our debt of sin. It is He who made atonement for us all by His blood...O let us in faith and with joy embrace the holy Christ Child, who so willingly submitted Himself to the most humble divine Law for us. Now no law that we have transgressed can damn us. Now God Himself, whom we have offended, can no longer be angry with us. Now like the old year itself. all our old sins have eternally disappeared."

My prayer for you this New Year is that you will know the joy and peace that comes from being reconciled to God. Like 2014 is gone, so are your sins, and having that knowledge is a great way to start your new year.

Circuit Convocation And Forum



Council Meeting Minutes—December 4, 2014

THOSE PRESENT: Pastor Peterson, Tom Reaman, Lannie Miller, Wes Drost, Lyle Tegels, Lance Peters, Jackie Wallace, Pat Smith and Deb Stehr.

Pastor opened with prayer. Tom Reaman called the meeting to order. Minutes from November 12th were read and approved. The financial report was given. Wes Drost made a motion, seconded by Lyle Tegels to accept the financial report. The motion passed.

ELDERS REPORT: Items for the treat bags will need to be purchased. Tammy Auen will donate candy bars and Kim and Wes Drost will donate the oranges. The rest will need to be bought. The elders will meet after church on the 17th to put the bags together. The Children's program is December 21th. The extra cups and ornaments left from the centennial were discussed. They will be available for a free will donation.

TRUSTEES REPORT: The hand rail by the back door will need to be extended. Lance Peters will put a cleanout valve in the sewer pipe. The heat tape in the gutters needs to be plugged in. A six or eight foot ladder needs to be purchased for the church.

PASTORS REPORT: Pastor made 6 shut-in visits, 1 counseling visit and 3 hospital visits. The LYF went to a hockey game November 22. Thanks to Wes, Kim, Roger and Jodi for helping drive. The vacancy has been going well.

OLD BUSINESS: Thrivent dollars were discussed. Requests are currently made to a committee. It was suggested that council be responsible since they already make budget decisions and would be good stewards of the money. Lannie Miller made a motion, seconded by Pat Smith that the council shall be responsible for Thrivent Dollar requests and distribution of the funds after written request has been made to the council. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS: The annual meeting was discussed. Officer nominations have not been filled yet, but there are some possibilities. The meeting is after church December 14th. Nominations will be taken from the floor if positions are not filled at that time.

The Elders and counters will be going to a weekly schedule in 2015. Tom Reaman thanked everyone for the volunteer work they do for the church. There will need to be another voters meeting in January to finalize plans and budget for the front step project. There was no more discussion, so the meeting adjourned.
