#### WHITE AS SNOW

I have been blest to spend a large majority of my life living in the Midwest. I've moved from Minnesota to Nebraska to Colorado (which is more west than Midwest) to Indiana to Washington (way west) to Indiana to Minnesota finally to Iowa. In all these states (even in Washington) winters have included a fair amount of snow. Some winters it was more, others less, but every winter I have been able to watch the falling flakes cover everything in a beautiful coat of white.

When it first falls the snow is quite beautiful as it covers up the brown grass and dirt fields. But it doesn't take long for the snow to lose its loveliness; cars and plows throw up sand and dirt, geese leave their "mark", and the brilliant white just fades away. But then the sky once again opens up and drops down a snowy blanket and everything is beautiful again.

I bring this all up because it's snowing this February morning, but also because it is a great illustration about our lives. When we're baptized, we're clothed in the sparkling white gown of Christ and the forgiveness of sins. David said in Psalm 51:7, "Wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow" and truer words haven't been spoken. When we are washed in the water of Baptism, we're cleansed of all the evil and sin that cling to us and we are pure as the new fallen snow.

But then what happens? We go through our day and it doesn't take long for our snow white gowns to become disgustingly filthy. Our daily sins leave their mark, our acts of disobedience to God cause our white gowns to fade, and our sins against others throw up dirt and grime all over us, and before you know it, what was once a brilliant white is now a dingy grey or even a soiled black.

So what do we do now that we are muddy and mucky from our sins? We do the only thing we can - we go back to our baptism. We remember that we are baptized and because we are baptized we are forgiven. In His death, Christ Jesus has given us the forgiveness of sins which restores our soiled gowns back to their dazzling white. As Isaiah said, "Come now, let us reason together, says the LORD: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow." This is the wonderful news that is for you! You're forgiven, you're not grey or black, you're white as snow. Every day, we return to our baptisms that we might once again have our sins washed away and receive the brilliant snow white gown of forgiveness.
