Justin Martyr

Jesus says, "Everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 10:32-33)

In honor of Justin Martyr whose life and death we commemorate on June 1st, I would like to share a dramatic eyewitness account of his trial (along with six of his friends) written shortly after his death in 165 A.D. I have shortened it for our newsletter. I pray that his Christian testimony will encourage you in the face of all opposition to the Gospel of Christ Jesus.

+The saints were seized and brought before the prefect of Rome, whose name was Rusticus. As they stood before the judgment seat, Rusticus the prefect said to Justin: "Above all, have faith in the gods and obey the emperors". Justin said: "We cannot be accused or condemned for obeying the commands of our Savior, Jesus Christ".

Rusticus said: "What system of teaching do you profess?" Justin said: "I have tried to learn about every system, but I have accepted the true doctrines of the Christians, though these are not approved by those who are held fast by error".

The prefect Rusticus said: "Are those doctrines approved by you, wretch that you are?" Justin said: "Yes, for I follow them with their correct teaching".

The prefect Rusticus said: "What sort of teaching is that?" Justin said: "Worship the God of the Christians. We hold him to be from the beginning the one creator and maker of the whole creation, of things seen and things unseen. We worship also the Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God. He was foretold by the prophets

as the future herald of salvation for the human race and the teacher of distinguished disciples. For myself, since I am a human being, I consider that what I say is insignificant in comparison with his infinite godhead. I acknowledge the existence of a prophetic power, for the one I have just spoken of as the Son of God was the subject of prophecy. I know that the prophets were inspired from above when they spoke of his coming among men".

Rusticus said: "You are a Christian, then?" Justin said: "Yes, I am a Christian".

The prefect said to Justin: "You are called a learned man and think that you know what is true teaching. Listen: if you were scourged and beheaded, are you convinced that you would go up to heaven?" Justin said: "I hope that I shall enter God's house if I suffer that way. For I know that God's favor is stored up until the end of the whole world for all who have lived good lives".

The prefect Rusticus said: "Do you have an idea that you will go up to heaven to receive some suitable rewards?" Justin said: "It is not an idea that I have; it is something I know well and hold to be most certain".

The prefect Rusticus said: "Now let us come to the point at issue, which is necessary and urgent. Gather round then and with one accord offer sacrifice to the gods". Justin said: "No one who is right thinking stoops from true worship to false worship".

The prefect Rusticus said: "If you do not do as you are commanded you will be tortured without mercy". Justin said: "We hope to suffer torment for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, and so be saved. For this will bring us salvation and confidence as we stand before the more terrible and universal judgment-seat of our Lord and Savior".

Dorcas Society Meeting-May 14, 2015



Glorifying God, the holy martyrs went out to the accustomed place. They were beheaded, and so fulfilled their witness of martyrdom in confessing their faith in their Savior.

And some of the faithful having secretly removed their bodies, laid them in a suitable place, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ having wrought along with them, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.+

Pastor opened the meeting with prayer. Gary Kruse called the meeting to order. The minutes from April 8th were read and approved. The financial report for April was given. Wes Drost made a motion, seconded by Dave Woltman to approve the financial report. The motion passed.


PASTORS REPORT: Pastor gave his report. He made 10 shut-in visits, 4 hospital visits and 1 counseling visit. District President, Pastor Sieveking is retiring. Vacation Bible School is June 1-5. The theme is Camp Discovery. We still need volunteers to help. Door offerings will be taken on May 17th and 24th. The church will help purchase hotdogs and buns for the Sunday celebration following VBS. Pastor will be on vacation June 11-21 and will be out of state the entire time. Pastor Carlisle and Pastor Pobanz will cover for him and Pastor John Schauer will fill in on June 21st. District Convention will be at Camp Okoboji June 22-23. Pilgrim Church has received a candidate who will be ordained and installed probably July5th. We will continue to have church at 10:00 for now and change it in July. The next council meeting will be June 9th.

OLD BUSINESS: The Front Step Project was discussed. We have received one bid and are waiting on the second one. We would like to have the work done in June or July and it will take about two weeks or three at the most. The radon problem in the parsonage was discussed. Thrashers gave a bid for \$2,500 and a contractor from Ida Grove gave a bid for \$1,400. Randy Drost made a motion, seconded by Lannie Miller to accept the Bid from the Ida Grove contractor and use Celebration funds to pay for it. The motion passed. A new church sign was discussed. An electronic LED sign would cost \$8,000 to \$16,000. There was much discussion on it. Getting an estimate from Ron Bettin to fix the old one was suggested. There was discussion about Pat moving into the parsonage, with the biggest concern being her dogs. Dave Woltman made a motion, seconded by Beth Hatch to allow Pat to move in with Pastor and Jennifer as long as the dogs are not allowed in the house. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS: Handicapped parking in the back of the church was discussed, along with installing a chairlift. No action was taken at this time. Having a contemporary service was suggested to think about and discuss at the June meeting and also having a family night.

New Business:

Mission Projects: Londa presented some mission ideas sent by the District. Three different ideas were presented: Vietnam Veterans of America, "Takin' it to the Streets" outreach in Omaha and Food for Children in Haiti. After much discussion, it was decided to encourage the Sunday School and VBS groups to donate their offerings to the Food for Children in Haiti as children do enjoy helping other children. This project is to help kids receive meals during the summer months when school is not in session and they may not have access to any other food. The decision was then made to first focus on the "Takin' it to the Streets" outreach project in Omaha for many reasons, including the fact that it is fairly local and will actually take place in early August. The DOEs will open this up to the congregation and encourage all to donate needed items, but will serve to organize the donations and get them to the project leader. Londa will be contacting the project leader to determine if they want the items assembled into packages or "kits" and if gently used caps can be donated. The DOEs will "fill in" any items that are needed to make complete packages. After this project is complete, our attention will turn to the Vietnam Veterans of America. The collection is similar and gives us an opportunity to support our veterans here at home.

Annual Family Potluck:

Date of our potluck was confirmed to be Monday, August 3rd at 6:30 pm. It will again be held at the open Shelter House in Speaker House unless temperatures are uncomfortably high. Everyone should bring a dish to share. We will touch base with President Mollie regarding whether or not silverware and napkins will be provided or if members should bring their own. Additional Information:

The question was asked if Pilgrim Lutheran (Lake City) has received a pastor. Jennifer was able to confirm they have received a candidate and his scheduled ordination is July 12th. This means Pastor will be able to return to our meetings and lead us in Bible Study. Along those lines, Jennifer presented the question of whether we want to continue with LWML Quarterly studies or if the membership would like to delve into a topical study. She mentioned that a new CPH catalog had just come out with lots of timely and meaningful studies available for women, most are 6-8 sessions and would fit our "yearly schedule" very well. Members are encouraged to prayerfully consider what they would like to do and communicate this to President Mollie on or before the Annual Potluck, so this information can in turn be given to Pastor. Mites and Offering were collected.

The Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

We will have a collection box in the Fellowship Hall. Donations may be made until July 15th. Thank you in advance for helping us with this mission.


