Church Membership—Part 5

As we continue the discussion about Church Membership, I want to start by asking you a question. Are you ready? Here it is: Why do you attend church services? Go ahead and think about it for a few minutes, I'll wait. Do you attend to be entertained? To praise God? To see family and friends? Because it's a habit? To hear God's Word? Because you like the songs? Because you woke up early? Because Pastor is awesome (okay, maybe not)? Because there's nothing else going on? Here's another question for you and it's a little harder for me to ask: Why don't you attend church services? You don't like the songs? You're made at someone? It's the only day to sleep in? Because it's the one day where you can do what you want? The service isn't exciting? The kids have games/practice/dance? Pastor is boring (nah, that can't be it)? You don't get anything out of it?

When our reasons for attending or not attending services are based on us or what we want or don't want, we're missing the point of the Divine Service. And the point of the Divine Service is that God (the Divine) comes to serve you. This is why attending church services is the single most important thing for Christians to do. What happens on Sunday mornings occurs nowhere else in the life of the Christian. Sure, you can read your Bible at home (which I hope you do), you can say prayers in the car, and you can listen to hymns while you work, but none of these things are meant to stand on their own. Instead, God calls us to gather as often as possible in His house where He comes down to feed us with His Word, His Body and Blood. The purpose of Church is for God to act on you. You're passive. Sundays are all about what God does for you – He forgives you! That's why we gather! We gather to be forgiven and that forgiveness encourages you to live as a Christian in a sinful world until you gather again the next Sunday. Sunday services are all about God's love and forgiveness for you for the sake of Jesus Christ.

We judge all service according to their purposes. Movies are to entertain, if one doesn't, it wasn't good. Doctor visits are for healing, if you aren't healed, it wasn't a good visit. You get the point. If they do what they were supposed to do, we're pleased. But you can't judge a church service by how you feel it met the purpose you assigned to it. Your sins are forgiven whether you feel they are or not. You have been fed by God in Holy Communion whether you feel fed or not. The sermon gives you God's Word whether it was boring or exciting. Holy Absolution forgave your sins. In this way, a Divine Service is only bad when it doesn't give you Christ and the forgiveness of your sins!

People who frequently say that church is boring or they don't get anything out of it are missing the purpose of church. When we compare what happens at Emmanuel on Sunday mornings to playing golf, shopping, and watching the latest blockbuster movie, the argument could be made that other things are more exciting. However, you can't compare what occurs in the Divine Service to other activities. Activities outside of church are entertainment while the Divine Service is not about being entertained. It's about being served and cared for by God. We also come to learn, pray, and praise God, but these are all in response to what God has first done for us. The purpose of the Divine Service is to give you all the gifts of God, and this is why we gather in God's church.

Pastor opened the meeting with prayer. Lannie called the meeting to order. Minutes from the Mar 14 meeting were emailed to all council members. Minutes were approved. The financial report for Mar 2018 was tabled until the next meeting.

Trustee Report: The new toilet was installed in the women's bathroom in the basement. Pastor picked up a faucet for the kitchen at the parsonage and will contact MGM to come and install it.

Elder Report: No Elders Report

Pastors Report: Visits: 3 hospital/sick, 6 shut in, counseling 1. Judy Malone funeral was held Mar 19. The Lenten meals and services were well attended.

Evangelism Committee Report: The Fish Fry and Easter Egg Hunt were both well attended and went very well.

Old Business: The communion vote passed 56 yes, 19 no. Beginning April 15 communion will be weekly. New Business: Discussion was held on how communion will run once its brought down to the new railing. It will run similar to Peace in Wall Lake and Pilgrim in Lake City. It should actually make communion run quicker. When communion is moved down we will be able to use the current privacy shields that are in the front. Kneelers will be made. The front couple rows of pews will need to be removed. There is a sign-up sheet in the fellowship hall to help prepare communion each week. Pastor will be going to a conference in Wisconsin July 30-Aug 1 for his continuing education. The topic for this conference is Pastoral Ministry. The conference is free, and council voted to cover hotel costs for Pastor while at the conference. Dave made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Randy. Motion passed. Due to Pastor being asked to speak at the senior baccalaureate the next council meeting will be changed from Wednesday to Tuesday May 8th.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. A motion was made by Marlin and seconded by Randy to adjourn the meeting.

News from Camp Okoboji



When the Walther League purchased Camp Okoboji in 1939, they had no idea how wonderful a tradition they were creating for so many individuals and families. On April 7, Camp Okoboji held its annual meeting with 15 Board Members, 52 Delegates, 21 Auxiliary Members, 20 guests, and five staff members present. Everyone at the meeting shared a true love for Camp and a passion to keep it growing into the future.

The Board put forward a vote to make slight changes to Articles of Incorporation. Some highlights from the vote: Article I – the name Iowa West Walther League Summer Camp Association has been changed to Camp Okoboji Lutheran Association. Article V – the Board of Directors will consist of nine members rather than 18. The nine members will

include three ordained ministers, one commissioned minister, and five lay members. Article VI-a congregation's delegate does not need to be a layperson and now can be the pastor.

With the downsizing of the Board, Delegates voted with three separate ballots to create a new Board. Current members are Reverends Benjamin Dose, David Lyons, and Robert Zellmer; Laypersons Kenneth Bishop, Joy Brown, Tom Chapman, Scott Ebel, and Marc Lansink; and Commissioned Minister Rhonda Mohr.

The Auxiliary report included Theme Basket silent auction results (which will go to sheet sets) as well as 2017's successful efforts: new mattresses, new shuffleboard cover, financial assistance to complete the picnic shelter, kitchen supplies and grocery shower, new playground sand, six Cub Week camperships, dining hall décor, Discover Center furniture and signage, ten picnic tables, landscaping and rain garden at the Discover Center, and an outdoor walk-in freezer. This year's Quilt Auction will be July 7. Quilts need to be to Camp by May 28.

Retiring Executive Director Doug Kading reported on his past 30 years of service and thanked everyone for their support. Kirk Warnke was installed as the new Executive Director. The two will work together for the next four months to ease the transition.
