#### Church Membership—Part 7

Over the last six months, I've given you a lot of material that has been intended to show you the importance belonging to our church and being active in Emmanuel. This month my series of articles on church membership comes to an end (maybe, I'll have to see), and I want to finish by talking about learning.

We parents, and state law, make sure that our children are in school every day. Barring any illness or doctor's appointments children are expected to be in school for seven hours a day, five days a week, and nine months of the year. But why is it? Is learning algebra that important? Do children really need to learn to read or to share? Do children need gym class or to be taught the importance of history and science?

If you ask the kids, they might say "No!", but adults answer with a resounding "Yes!". We know that while some children hate school or struggle in it, it's still a crucial part of their formation. An adult who can't read, might not know how much medicine to take. An adult who can't do simple math may struggle with maintaining a bank account. An adult who doesn't know history might embrace socialism. We force children to go to school because we know how important it is to learn subjects that will help them succeed (or just survive). And learning doesn't stop with graduation because adults also need to keep learning new skills.

So why is it, that we don't see the importance of Christian education? Many Christians consider Confirmation Day as graduation, as if they've learned all there is about God. They neglect Bible study and worship where God's Word is taught. Sometimes the assigned readings for a Sunday might be confusing, I try to explain one of them in the sermon. Adult Bible study is a low-pressure place to learn and to ask questions on any number of topics. We all have questions, right? Nobody completely understands everything that God says and so we attend church and Bible study to learn.

We also are commanded by God to make sure that our children are learning about Him in addition to math, history, and science. God says, "One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts" (Ps. 145:4) He also says, "You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise" (Deut. 6:7). Teaching your children about God can be intimidating, but it doesn't have to be! Sunday school teachers and pastors prepare for lessons so teaching becomes a team effort. Bible class is also a good place to learn more of God's Word so you can share what you know with your children.


#### Iowa District Convention Update

- President Steve Turner was re-elected to a second term as District President.
- *The Gate* Lutheran Church of Ankeny was officially received into IDW membership.
- Several handbook changes were approved (the proposed three term limit for the District President did not pass).
- A resolution was passed that encourages congregations to make outreach and acts of mercy priorities.
- A resolution was passed which directs Circuit Visitors to evaluate congregational communion practices and lead discussions towards implementing proper practices.
- A resolution was passed to celebrate the 125th Anniversary of Concordia University, Seward.
- A resolution to build an ark after 5 inches of rain narrowly failed.
