From the Pastor's Study

In just a couple of weeks (today is March 26th), the Church will be celebrating the greatest day in the history of the world – Easter. The earliest and most detailed description of Holy Week comes from a woman named Egeria. Between 381 and 384, Egeria travelled the Holy Land while writing back home. Egeria's account of Holy Week in Jerusalem is fascinating and highly detailed. To keep this article from being five pages, I've given you only the timeline and activities. 1:00 pm on Saturday before Palm Sunday: Christians gather for worship at the tomb of Lazarus in Bethany. So many gather that the church and all the fields around are filled with the faithful.

Palm Sunday Morning: When Sunday morning services at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher (located at the traditional site of Christ's crucifixion and tomb) have concluded, the faithful proceed to the *martyrium* (a larger church at Golgotha) for worship.

Palm Sunday at 1:00 pm: They gather at the Mount of Olives for worship.

Palm Sunday at 3:00 pm: They move to the traditional site of Jesus' Ascension for worship.

Palm Sunday at 5:00 pm: The faithful follow the bishop to the top of the Mount of Olives, crying out: "*Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord.*" while waving palm branches. The faithful then make the trek from the Mount of Olives through Jerusalem to the tomb of Jesus.

Wednesday night: At the tomb of Jesus the priest reads the account of Judas' meeting with the Jews to betray Jesus. Egeria writes: "*And when the passage has been read, there is such a moaning and groaning of all the people that no one can help being moved to tears at that hour.*"

2:00 pm to 5:00 pm on Maundy Thursday: They gather at the church at Golgotha where they have worship with Holy Communion. At 4:00 pm they gather at the traditional site of the crucifixion for readings, one hymn, and Holy Communion.

5:00 pm to 7:00 pm: They return home to eat and rest in preparation for the evening.

7:00 pm Maundy Thursday to 3:00 am on Good Friday: They gather at the church in Gethsemane for readings, prayers, and hymns. At 1:00 am, they proceed to the site of the Ascension for further worship. **3:00 am on Good Friday:** They gather at the church in Gethsemane to hear the account of the Garden from the Gospels. Following this, the entire congregation slowly makes their way to the traditional site of Jesus' prayer, where they receive candles and the arrest of Jesus is read. Egeria writes: *"And when this passage has been read there is so great a moaning and groaning of all the people, together with weeping, that their lamentation may be heard perhaps as far as the city."*

Whew! Are you still with me? Okay, let's go on.

4:00 am or so: They head for Jerusalem arriving at the city gate about dawn and proceed through the city. It's reported that no one drops out because of the importance of the day.

Daybreak: They arrive at the church of the crucifixion where the Gospel covering Jesus' encounter with Pilate and Pilate's interaction with the Jews is read. The people are dismissed until 8:00 am for rest and refreshment. **8:00 am to 12:00 pm:** The faithful gather to worship and honor a piece of the cross Jesus had supposedly been crucified upon. There is also the supposed sign from the cross written by Pilate.

12:00 to 3:00 pm: The people assemble at the Church of the Sepulcher in such great numbers that there's no way to get past. For three hours the people hear passages regarding Christ's passion from the New and Old Testaments, with hymns interspersed. They also hear sermons appropriate for Good Friday showing how Christ fulfilled the prophecies of the Old Testament.

3:00 pm: They read the passage from the Gospel according to John where Jesus gave up His spirit. After that, they proceed from the portion of the church dedicated to the Cross to the portion dedicated to the Tomb of Jesus to hear how Joseph of Arimathea requested the body of Jesus and then buried Him.

3:00 pm Friday to Noon Saturday: Those who are able and willing remain at the church for the Vigil of Easter praying and singing hymns. After which they hear the Easter readings and are sent home to await Easter worship.

Unfortunately, Egeria's writings for Easter Sunday are missing so we don't know how Easter was commemorated. But this got me thinking: should we resurrect the traditions that Egeria experienced? It might be a bit hard to get anyone to buy into such a long week. However, if they could do it, why can't we? Something to contemplate this Easter season.
