From the Pastor's Study

Once a year, for six or seven weeks in a row (depending on when a congregation observes Ascension Day), the "tall candle" is lit in the Sanctuary. When I tell the acolytes which candles to light, I have to identify it as "the tall candle". Even many of our members view it as the "tall candle". But did you know that "the tall candle" isn't its official name? The official name is the *Paschal Candle*, and outside of the Easter season, it's only lit for baptisms and funerals.

The word *Paschal* comes from the Greek, *pascha* which means "to pass over". *Pascha* comes from the Hebrew word for Passover. The first Passover was the night the Lord passed over Egypt and struck the firstborn sons of the Egyptians for their unbelief and refusal to let Israel leave Egypt. Over time, Christians took to using the word when referring to the Festival of the Resurrection. In many parts of the world, *pascha* is used instead of Easter (the term Easter came into use in later centuries).

The Paschal candle reminds us of Christ's victory over the darkness of sin and death. It also indicates that Jesus is the perfect Passover Lamb sacrificed for the sins of the world. The last two years we've begin the sunrise service in darkness with only the Paschal candle lit to symbolize the appearance of light out of darkness through the Lord's resurrection.


The Paschal candle has a long history in the Church with its use first recorded in 384, and by the tenth century it had gained general usage.

The Paschal candle is also used for funerals and baptisms. It's lit for funerals to again remind the mourners that Jesus has conquered death and the grave, and that it's in the resurrected Lord that we find our hope and comfort in the death of loved ones. In the early centuries of Christianity, baptisms were conducted during the Easter Vigil (the service on Saturday night) or on Easter. We continue to light the Paschal candle at baptisms to show the baptized has been transferred from the darkness of sin and death and to the marvelous light of Christ.

I hope this answers your questions about "the tall candle" and now when you see it, you'll know what it means: the miracle of the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.
