From the Pastor's Study

If you did a quick web search for the characteristics of a strong congregation, you'd find that there are plenty of experts who have the answer. Some lists overlap, some differ, some are theologically bad, others less so. For the most part, I think their lists are fairly accurate. A strong congregation loves Christ, reaches out to its community, is friendly and welcoming, has members that tithe and/or give regular offerings, and is Biblically faithful. I'm not an expert who has done extensive research on this topic, but I do know what's missing on most lists: Bible study attendance. I am certain that a congregation which studies the Bible together will be stronger in every regard. Okay, now stick with me, don't skip the rest of this article because you're not interested in Bible study. I ask and pray you hear me out.

Here's a Top Eleven list of the reasons God wants you to attend Bible Study and why a congregation immersed in God's Word is stronger than most.

- **Your Christian faith is like a plant.** A plant that isn't watered, fed, or exposed to the sun is going to die. Your faith will shrivel, and you run the risk of it dying, if you don't regularly feed it and expose it to the Son. Jesus says, *"Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God"* (Matt 4:4).
- **You didn't learn it all in Confirmation class.** Confirmation instruction is crucial for the development of the faith of our youth as they work toward the Rite of Confirmation. What Lutherans don't understand is that Christian education is a lifelong endeavor which doesn't end at 8th grade.
- **You don't know it all.** You read the instructions for a recipe, a piece of equipment, or anything else because you don't know everything. You will never learn or know enough when it comes to your faith and Savior. How can you?
- You need to teach your children. What's the best way to show your children that Sunday school is important? Attend yourself! What's the best way to teach your children about Jesus? With the knowledge you gain from Bible Study.
- **There's nothing more important than your faith.** There's not a thing more important than what God has done for you in Christ Jesus, you show God you know this and give Him praise when you study His Word.

- **Bible Study equips you to face life.** Every one of you is going to face a turbulent, trying time. It might be a death, a divorce, retirement, work, school, the list is virtually endless. Wouldn't it be great to be able to draw on God's promises and the stories of His faithfulness when confronted by these hard-ships? How do you do that? By learning them!
- **Bible Study aids you in your battle against Satan.** The Devil is a prowling lion looking for a Christian to devour (I Peter 5:8). How do you defend yourself? With the armor of God which is provided to you in faith, your baptism, the Lord's Supper, and His Word. Satan must flee when confronted by God's Word. Learn God's Word and the Devil will flee from you.
- **Bible study strengthens a Christian life.** Regular exposure to God's Word helps you distinguish between right and wrong, and not just to distinguish, to act. When you've been in God's Word, it's easier to choose right over wrong. And it's where you find the forgiveness of your sins and, by the power of the Holy Spirit, move forward as a new creation in Christ.
- **The congregation is a family.** We meet for worship and Bible study to encourage one another, to work together to face challenges, and see that Christians from all walks of life share many of the same fears and burdens. We study God's Word together to help one another as Christians.
- **You need organized Bible studies.** Sure, you can study the Bible on your own, but do you? And if you do, how do you know that you're on the right track? How do you find answers to your questions? Google? I sure hope not. Group Bible studies enable you to ask questions, hear the thoughts of others, and explore the text more deeply while encouraging others in their Christian walk.
- **Jesus calls you to be vocal in your faith.** How can you answer the questions of others about Jesus if you don't know the answers? As Peter says, "*In your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you*" (1 Peter 3:15).

This is a list of eleven reasons, but with more time (and space in the newsletter), I'm sure we could come up with more. God commands worship, Bible study, and that Christians assemble together. God commands these things because they're good for you! If you worship and study the Bible, what's the worst thing that can happen? All of Emmanuel will grow in its faith and Christian life? If you don't worship and study the Bible, what's the worst thing that can happen? Eternal death.

Make plans to stay after service on September 10th to eat ice cream, talk about Bible study, and Sunday school, and kick off a great school year.

6th grade – starting confirmation


8th grade – this year's confirmands
