From the Pastor's Study

This past week I had my annual physical. I was going to cancel it, but Jennifer refused to let me, and she was right. It's one of those things we must do, even if it's unpleasant. In between questions about blood pressure and cholesterol, the doctor and I had an interesting discussion about addictive behavior. Those who abuse alcohol or drugs can hit rock bottom which forces them to make changes. Those who smoke and eat too much don't hit rock bottom in the same way which makes overeating and smoking harder habits to break. I'm not a smoker, but I do love to eat so what he said made sense to me.

I was thinking about this discussion, and I wonder if it is too big a leap to compare overeating to the Bible. Too many Christians are on a starvation diet when it comes to the Bible. They nibble a little bit here and there. If they attend service, they're given a delicious meal, but overall, Christians are not nourishing themselves with the Word of God.

Jesus says that He is the Bread of Life and that those who eat of Him through faith will have eternal life. He also tells satan, "Man does not live on bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." Jesus invites us, no it's more than that, He urges us to come be fed with the words that come from the mouth of God.

The Bible is the Word of God and gives food to those who are spiritually hungry and starving to death. All the nourishment we need are found between two covers: food to replenish depleted hearts, encouragement for the discouraged, healing for the broken, forgiveness for the sinner, and the list goes on.

While it's easy to overeat on Thanksgiving until your buttons burst or to have that second piece of cake, it's impossible to overeat what God has written down for your benefit and to bless you. Feast on His Word! Keep a Bible app on your phone, read the Portals of Prayer, ask me for some devotional materials, and you'll find your hunger begin to be satisfied. Then eat and eat some more, fill yourself, and as we say in one prayer "inwardly digest" that Word which gives life and salvation.


Trustee Report: there was some water in church basement-a dehumidifier is now in place. Air Conditioner is still not fixed. Light in Parsonage laundry is not working.

New Business: none



Staley's Chicken Dinner


Sign ups sheets are available in the Fellowship Hall for the Chicken Dinner on August 25th.
