From the Pastor's Study

A couple of times in our Women's Bible study, we've been a little sidetracked (which is okay) with discussions regarding the differences between Lutheranism and Roman Catholicism. Our former Roman Catholic members remembered the stress of confessing all their sins to the priest, along with the stress of knowing that if they weren't confessed, they weren't forgiven. This was certainly contrary to the word and will of God. Our sins are forgiven in corporate confession and absolution, in the Lord's Prayer, in Holy Communion, and in Holy Baptism. These are all means by which we receive God's gift of grace. But did you know that the Lutheran Church does have Private Confession?

For many people the idea of Private Confession smacks of Roman Catholicism and having to list all your sins in order to be forgiven. Because of the abuse of Private Confession by the Roman Catholic Church (and because the idea of penance ran contrary to the Gospel message of Jesus Christ) the practice of Private Confession gradually died out in the Lutheran Church.

While Martin Luther and the reformers sought to correct the abuses of Private Confession, they didn't want to get rid of it. In the Augsburg Confession (an official statement of Lutheran doctrine written in 1530): "Our churches teach that private absolution should be retained in the churches. However, in confession an enumeration of all sins is not necessary, for this is not possible according to the Psalm, 'Who can discern his errors?'" (Augsburg Confession, Article XI)

Luther once said, "Nevertheless I will allow no man to take private confession away from me, and I would not give it up for all the treasures in the world, since I know what comfort and strength it has given me." Luther saw the need to give people the opportunity to unburden their consciences to the Pastor and to receive the forgiveness of sins after their confession.

Now one of the first questions is "Why?" Why do we need Private Confession if we have Confession and Absolution every Sunday morning? When you confess your sins on Sunday mornings and hear my absolution, your sins are forgiven. The problem is that sometimes people don't feel forgiven on Sunday morning. Standing in a big group, it's easy to feel that the Absolution is a little impersonal and that it can't apply to their particular situation and it's easy to think that the Pastor is talking to everyone else but them. It's at times like this that Private Confession and Absolution is a wonderful gift of God to the Church.

In Private Confession and Absolution, you are given the opportunity to share with the Pastor the particular sins that are bothering you. You confess your sins personally to me, as Christ's representative, and then I lay my hands on your head bestowing on you Christ's forgiveness of all your sins. In private confession, there's a personal element that's sometimes missing on Sundays and there can be a soothing comfort that comes from privately confessing your sins.

Rest assured, whatever sins you confess to me not only are forgiven, but no one will ever know either that you confessed to me or what you confessed. This is the Seal of Confession a vow I made to God at my ordination to keep confessions to myself.

This is just a brief overview of the Lutheran practice of Private Confession and Absolution and it's intended to whet your appetite for an immensely comforting way of hearing God's Word of forgiveness. Currently, I don't have any special times set up to hear confession, but I am willing to hear your confession anytime. If this is something you desire or have more questions, please contact me.

Mission ideas – checking on IOWAY ideas, voted and approved paying to rent a tux for an ESC student – Rachel will work on this


