A recurring theme in Jesus' teachings is the imminent end of the world. It will come in the blink of an eye, like a thief in the night, or like a man returning home from a trip in the middle of the night. He warns us to stay awake because we don't know when the master will appear. In other parts of Scripture, we are likewise warned to be prepared for our Lord's return on the Last Day. While Christ's return may come a long time from now, the fact is that any day can be our last day.

How's that for sobering? Steve Jobs said, "If you live each day as it was your last, someday you'll most certainly be right." I'm not sure if any of us want to think about life that way, but maybe we should. What would our attitude be if we knew that tomorrow we were meeting the Lord? Great question! If hymns are just songs, we could sing fewer stanzas.

However, hymns aren't just songs. They're prayers, songs of praise, stories, confessions (of our sins and our faith), proclamation of what we believe, and God's Word. If we don't sing all the stanzas you might not see how the hymn fits together, it will seem to end abruptly, or you won't get the whole story. Challenge yourself to focus on the words and try to identify the type of hymn. If you don't want to sing (or get tired), read or meditate on the words. Make it a prayer, make a note of any questions the hymn might stir up, or sit back and enjoy the singing of those around you.
