From the Pastor's Study

The last two of the Ten Commandments deal with coveting: do not covet your neighbor's spouse and do not covet your neighbor's house (all their possessions). I would never say God did it wrong, but I wonder if there should've been an eleventh commandment – do not covet your neighbor's life. Maybe this was less of an issue in the time of Moses, but today with Facebook, Instagram, Tik Tok, TV, the Internet, YouTube and the rest, all we see are other people's lives, and usually, though not always, what we see are happy families, great jobs, and wonderful vacations.

Social media (which ironically is making us less social) by it's nature is intended to make others feel bad. Okay, maybe I'm exaggerating, a little. There are plenty of pictures out there focusing on disasters, cancer, and the like, and I think those can make us look outside of our own little bubbles.

However, why do we mainly see pictures of beautiful sunsets and not pictures of our bout with airsickness? Why do we post pictures of our fancy dinners and not the burned beef roast and runny mashed potatoes? Why do we post vacation pictures and not the fights that occur on the way to the destination? Why do we post wedding pictures and not the tear-stained face of a spouse who just received divorce papers?

It's human nature that we don't want anyone to see our messy, ugly lives. We keep them hidden, which makes everyone (maybe I'm exaggerating again) think that our lives are perfect and theirs woefully short of good, let alone perfect. I wonder what we would think if social media showed what was really going on in the neighbor's life? Would we be jealous or relieved?

We can't always pierce the veil between social media and real life. Maybe you'll never know the struggles of your neighbors like they won't know yours. In our struggles to find perfection or better lives, we lose sight of the truth. The truth is that Jesus came down into our messy, screwed up, imperfect lives. He got down in the muck and mire of our daily existence. And why? Because He is the one who brings the beauty of forgiveness and the joy of hope and help.

Jesus says, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Luke 4:18-19). He knows our fights and divorces, our addictions and regrets, our rejections and failures. He knows them and He walks through them with us. He promises that fires won't burn His people and waters won't drown them. The forgiveness of sins cleanses us of our shame, hurts, and the hurts we've put on others. He walks with us through our imperfect lives, steering us and guiding us to our heavenly home.

Life will never be like the Brady Bunch or Leave it to Beaver. Life will never be a perfect Instagram picture. It probably won't be set to music like TikTok or a TV show. It will never be good as all the Facebook posts make you think it should be. Real life is full of sin and hurts. Left on our own, we'd only make a worse mess of things. Praise God that He sent His Son into our messy lives, to take those messes to the cross, so that we know with certainty, that we're never alone. Sure, social media makes everything look great, but what makes life truly great is the love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Even with them in your life, there's no guarantee of a happily ever after so forget what everyone has or does and instead look at what Jesus has done and does for you. You have a glorious treasure waiting for you – eternal life by the throne of God. You won't live vicariously through pictures or videos, you'll be experiencing it firsthand, and that can never be topped by a vacation picture or a sunset video.
