From the Pastor's Study

July 4th rightly stands as one of the most important dates in the history of the United States. On that date in 1776 the Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, and by doing so declared, "*That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved.*" In the midst of the Revolutionary War, 56 men, representing each of the colonies, took a stand and announced their freedom from British rule.

This freedom would not come easily as the Revolutionary War continued for another seven years until the British formally acknowledged the Independence of the United States in the Treaty of Paris in 1783. Over the eight years the war raged, the Colonists endured thousands of casualties due to combat and disease. Just like in any war, there were grumblings at times, but the Colonists never wavered in their desire for absolute freedom. The freedom that they won is a key principle of the United States and it is an ideal we treasure to this day.

Freedom is a precious commodity that not everyone in this world gets to enjoy. In most parts of the world freedoms we take for granted such as religion, press, and speech, are severely limited or non-existent. As we celebrate 249 years of independence I urge you to take a few minutes to thank God for the blessings of living in a free country.

While you are doing that I would like to remind you of another freedom that you get to enjoy, not a freedom to speak what you want or from having to house soldiers against your will, but a better freedom, a more powerful freedom. This is the freedom that comes to you through Christ Jesus, a freedom from Sin, Death, and the Devil.

The truth is that you are born enslaved by Sin and Death. Jesus says, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin." and Paul says "Formerly, when you did not know God, you were enslaved to those that by nature are not gods." The Sin in which you are conceived and in which you live keeps you in unbreakable chains that keep you under its control. This makes it sound like there is no escape, that we are condemned to a life serving cruel masters but this isn't the case at all!

In another hard fought victory, Jesus set us free from those who would enslave us. The blood He shed dissolves the chains that would hold us forever in bondage. His cry of "It is finished" is the Christian Declaration of Independence from Sin and Death. We can now hear the words of Christ and be assured that our sins are forgiven and that we are completely free from the consequences and control of our Sin.
